ROOT CANAL TREATMENT is a dental procedure to remove inflamed or infected pulp on the inside of the tooth which is then carefully cleaned and disinfected, then filled and sealed. Root canal treatment is designed to eliminate bacteria from the infected root canal, prevent reinfection of the tooth and save the natural tooth.









IS A ROOT CANAL TREATMENT PAINFUL ??

NO, it is painless, with modern technology and expert care it is not painful anymore.

A root canal treatment typically takes around 2 sittings to finish.





CAN YOU DO A ROOT CANAL



Works best in selected cases

Not every tooth is suitable for a single sitting. If there is severe infection, swelling, or pus discharge, we may need to treat it in multiple sittings for safety

So single-sitting root canals are safe, effective, and convenient when chosen for the right cases. Always trust your dentist to guide you on what's best for your tooth.

CAN A ROOT CANAL TREATMENT FAIL ??

YES BUT RARELY, root canal treatment can fail sometimes due to one of the following reasons.



Possible, if there are remanant bacteria even after root canal treatment, in some case a tooth may have narrow canals that can be missed cleaning.



If the tooth has a hidden crack, it becomes very difficult to seal it completely, and this can lead to failure

3. DELAY IN CROWN OR AN ILL FITTING CROWN



After a root canal, the tooth becomes weak. If you delay putting a crown (cap), germs can re-enter and damage the tooth again. If the filling or crown does not fit tightly, bacteria can sneak inside the tooth and cause reinfection

4. TOO MUCH BITE PRESSURE (OCCLUSAL OVERLOAD)



If one tooth takes all the chewing force (because another tooth is missing), the root canal tooth can get overloaded and fail.



How to Prevent Root Canal Failure?

- Get your crown placed immediately after the root canal.
- Go for regular dental check-ups to detect problems early.
- Make sure your bite is balanced missing teeth should be replaced.
- Visit a dentist if you feel pain, swelling, or discomfort near the treated tooth.
